## Women's Council Minutes November 9, 2022

We will have Father Joe make 2 batches of caramels for our December bake sale. He would like to have a wrapping party.

Much discussion on the Hunter's Dinner. We cleared \$2397.64. (tickets sold, donations and leftovers sold.) There were 207 paid dinners, 45 take out, and 20 workers ate free. Next year: the ticket taking table will be moved into the dining room as in past years; there will be a separate cash box in the Take-out room; no orders taken ahead of time for Take-out; to tally the Take-out orders, we will use the Take-out slips rather than tickets;

we will try and come up with larger serving pans so refills don't slow up the serving process in the Take-out room; streamline the Take-out order slips. We will provide small take out boxes in the regular dining room.

We will put a flyer in the bulletin before the Hunter's Dinner to let the parish know how the Women's Council spends their money.

The December Bake Sale will take place on December 3. Mary and Rosanne showed the various Christmas plates, cups and tins and explained how the baked goods are repackaged for sale. Several ladies agreed to come on Friday to help pack for the Saturday sale. Bags, ribbons, and labels are provided for packaging.

There will be a celebration of Deacon Rick's 25th anniversary on Sunday, November 20th after Mass. Sharon will get a card, Mary will order and pick up the cake, and Rosanne will do coffee after Mass.

It was agreed to go out for lunch Dec. 14 after the meeting at the Turtle Town Cafe. Mary will reserve the room.
